TRUSTEE MEETING THE WORKSHOP GANG STOKE ROW NEWS DIARY

THE VIEW FROM THE CHAIR

The trustees met on 11 March. Unusually we had a number of absences so a number of items were deferred to the next meeting. The following matters were discussed or decided.

It was decided to go ahead immediately with installing a defibrillator. The hedge cutting on the A4 boundary had been completed to schedule. Club insurance was to be renewed immediately. The key register is being updated and will be reissued shortly.

In finance, the March pubic running had produced another healthy result with over $\pounds 1,000.00$ taken on the tracks. The electricity cost was expected to reduce shortly. More keys for the new safe were being ordered.

A membership reminder was to be e mailed to members before the end of the month.

Good progress was reported on the workshop refurbishment and materials ordered. Thanks were given to all those with a hand in this work. There was considerable waste material arising and it was agreed to deal with this as soon as possible. It was noted that work on the tracks was becoming a priority and an inspection should be held to assess this.

A comment had been received on overcrowding on the raised track platform during the recent public running. It was agreed that this could be alleviated by running a minimum of two carriages in busy periods up to the limit of stock available. In the meantime drivers should approach the station with extreme caution. A site visit would be arranged for trustees.

Club running was now on two Saturdays a month though recent days had been quieter than usual.

The question of boiler certificate lists was considered. It was decided that track marshals should ask to see certificates as before. The approved driver list is being updated however.

The club was represented at the Federation of Model Engineering Societies on 2 March, held at the Boscombe Down Aviation Museum *(well worth a visit. Ed).*

Regarding visits, discussion with Polly were continuing, and the visit planned to the Fawley Open day on 29 June is proving popular. Plans were made for the Stoke Row Rally club stand in June. This would depend on sufficient members supporting it. *(see page 4, Ed)*

It was noted that a member had come forward to assist the trustees. This was an item deferred until next month, as above.
