## THE VIEW FROM THE CHAIR

I apologise for the delay for this June issue of Prospectus. I have had a whole series of problems with my computer which includes the Publisher program. As we are well into the current month this Prospectus will be a short one with full resumption next issue which will include articles in further parts.

At least now I can include a short report on our open day on the on 14 June which was a great success with a number of clubs attending and full steaming days and tracks all day. Particular thanks go to all those who organised this event which was combined with our normal club running day. This made it simple to put together and it included some boiler tests for members being undertaken by Nigel.

Since the May issue we have had no less than two trustee meetings. Maintenance of the site continues and Nigel has reported on ongoing work with concrete supporting slabs for the ground level track; painting is also an everlasting job. For both of these and other tasks more help would be greatly appreciated. A prominent issue is also the loading arrangements for the raised track and this is again being looked at.

The June public running was very busy and produced a good income for the club. The July event will commence at 11 am to take account of the car show in the park and the need to avoid unwanted parking of vehicles. Private parties remain busy and the number of bookings with youngsters, scouts etc. continue.

I am very pleased to report that member Peter Jennings has agreed to take on the job of bookkeeper for the club. This will help us modernise the way we organise our finances. Thank you Peter. Other work has included the preparation of a risk assessment for the workshop.

On communications we are continuing to improve our website and how deal with questions that arise from this from outside bodies. Speaking as editor of Prospectus this is my 239<sup>th</sup> issue commencing from the autumn of 2006. I have enjoyed the job, but I have already said that I wish to stand down as editor upon reaching my 250th issue. This takes us to the middle of next year and I hope it will be possible to find a new editor to take it forward. I would like to continue as a contributor but without the onus of production. I think it should stay as a monthly issue otherwise it will lose its immediacy and probably a lot of the point in my opinion. But that will be up to members to decide.

Another aspect which has arisen is the question of DBS checking for those

involved in public running including drivers. It is the view of the trustees that this is the right thing to do starting from 1st of January next year. That will give us time to consider any comments and also to make arrangements to make it simple as possible for members. Please comment to the trustees on this if you have any views.
